REPORT OF SEARCH FOR PIPKIN DATA IN ENGLAND:

In early 1962, I wrote to the College of Arms, London, E. C. 4, to try to determine whon and from where the Pipkin family might have originated. I asked for early Pipkins or if possible any Typpkynn as I had heard this was the original spelling of the namo. Here is an extract of the answer:

... I am afraid that my searches in the official records were very disappointing and so I extend them to include various manuscripts and printed material.

I have to report that no family of Pipkin, Pypkyn or other reasonable variants of the name, has ever been granted or allowed arms, nor has any family of this name ever entered a pedigree in the records of the College of Arms.

The other sources I searched in the hope of locating the name were equally unrowarding. In case you over wish to make more extensive searches I have listed the baic sources which I searched.

1. Lewys Dwnn's "Visitation of Wales, 1586-1613".

2. Gilfach Mes (Welsh pedigroes).

- Frotheroe Mes (Welsh Pedigrees).
  College of Arms index to Miscellaneous pedigrees a entries.
  College of Arms index to Genealogical evidences in various of the collections.
- 6. Wills proved in the Prerogative Court of Cantorbury 1653-1656. (This was the short period whon the jurisdiction of this court covered all England & Walos).

7. Vincont Mes. (pedigross, genealogical notes, evidences, arms, etc, incl Walos.

8. Philpot Wes (same as above).

9. Marshall's Genoelogical Guideand Supplement.

10. Alumni Oxonionsos (list of all who matriculated at Oxford University up

to about 1900).

11. Alumni Centabridgionsos (counterpart of the above for Cambridge). Hero I had my only success. A cortain Ernost Stratford Pipkin, who later changed his name to Brnest Stratford Stratford, son of Samuel J. Pipkin of Surbiton, County Surrey, was born in 1876 and died in 1915. He was a Doctor. ... I can find no account of the otymology of the word Pipkin, except it may be a form of the name Popin.

NOTE: I include this in our newsletter, in order that any who may write to England will know what manuscripts have been searched and thus prevent duplication of offort. The Pursuivant of Arms suggested that he may be able to trace the family back from the father, Samuel J. Pipkin, however, I did not pursue the matter.
